Loughlinstown to Dean's Grange Cycle Route

Description: Shared cycle and pedestrian route mainly through parks and laneways linking Loughlinstown and Cabinteely to Dean's Grange

Distance: Total length of about 4.om

Cycle time: 16 – 20 minutes

For cyclists with a moderate level of To suit: fitness. The shared cycle and pedestrian routes in the park are suitable for young

children.

Links: Good links to nearby residential areas and schools and to shops in Dean's Grange and Ballybrack.

Route benefits: This route is an ideal recreational direct traffic free route for families that links Wyattville Road to Kill Avenue in Dean's Grange.

Cycle parking: Dean's Grange, Ballybrack.

Residential Areas: Ashlawn Park, Wyattville Park, Coolevin, Shanganagh Vale, Willowvale, Granville Road, Watsons Estate, Shrewsbury Lawn, Shrewsbury Wood, Cabinteely Green, Monaloe Way, Meadow Vale and Clookeen Cresent.

Schools: St. Colmcilles National School, Willowvale, Ballybrack, Johnstown Boys & Girls NS, Killiney, Kill-o-Grange National School, Dean's Grange, Cabinteely Community School, Johnstown Road. Clonkeen College, Dean's Grange Road, St. Laurence's Secondary School, Wyattville Park.

Leisure centres: DLR leisure centre - Loughlinstown

Retail outlets: Tesco, Ballybrack, Dean's Grange Retail Park, Pottery Road Retail Park, Supervalu, Dean's Grange, Lidl, Dean's Grange





Cycling in the County

In the 2012, the Council developed a County Cycle Network following an assessment of all existing routes in the County. The main objectives of this assessment were:

- > To identify and implement safe cycling routes to key destinations in the County.
- > To retrofit areas towards creating sustainable neighbourhoods so that cycling, together with walking, can be the best option for local trips.
- To help prioritise funding to deliver cost effective cyclefriendly improvements to the cycle network in the County.

The aim of the improved cycle network was to create conditions to encourage and facilitate increased levels of cycling in the County by providing direct routes with a high level of service. 

- Wyattville Road to Johnstown Road (2.okm) The route enters Kilbogget Park on the west
 side of Wyattville Road near Ashlawn Park
 and continues westwards along a shared
 cycle /pedestrian route through Kilbogget
 Park. The route is suitable for all ages except
 at the entry and exit from the park where
 guidance is required for younger children.
- Johnstown Road to Dean's Grange (1.9km)
 At the northern end of Kilbogget Park at
 Granville Road you turn onto Johnstown
 Road with the route entering ClonkeenPark
 (as known as Dean's Grange Linear Park)
 near Cabinteely Green and continues
 westwards along a shared cycle /pedestrian
 route to Kill Lane in Deasngrange exiting
 near the school. The route is suitable for all
 ages except at the entry and exit from the
 park where guidance is required for younger
 children.
- Cycle and pedestrian routes exist in Kilbogget Park that link onto the N11 Cycle route.
- There are future plans to extend the cycle route north-west to Blackrock and southeast to Bray.
